Comments/suggestions for change made by moderators concerning the current prescriptions of modules included in this round are as follows:

IP500

- It was noted that there are some typos and grammatical errors in the prescription

AP360

- Suggestion of an inclusion of a comment that the module is more about the use of tools as opposed to design

SP500 & SP510

- Could form the basis for a new 15 credit course. (Note that this could be done with SP590 and SP591/SP592 as well).

HM600

- Reconsider the need for individual component replacement

The above comments and suggestions for change will be taken into consideration by the group that continues the work of the Special Interest Groups of NACCQ's Curriculum & Quality Working Group. The ability to contribute to prescription changes is available to anyone once they have registered with any of the Special Interest Groups (SIGs)
